Unallowable Costs Related to PrEP

RWHAP legislation provides funds to be used for care and treatment of people diagnosed with HIV.

Thus prohibiting the use of RWHAP funds for PrEP medications and the related medical services such as physician visits and laboratory costs.

How the RWHAP Supports PrEP to End the HIV Epidemic

Builds PrEP services or programs on existing RWHAP systems, services, programs, personnel, and expertise,

- Leveraging what has been built over the past 25 years

Utilizes components of programmatic service categories related to:

- HIV testing and referral
- Psychosocial support for affected family members
- Risk reduction education for partners of people with HIV

- Recognizes the importance of PrEP and acknowledges the role of RWHAP system of care and services
- Shares legislative parameters

RWHAP PrEP Training/Webcast

- Provides training to recipients/subrecipients on how to leverage RWHAP provider expertise and infrastructure to support PrEP within legislative parameters

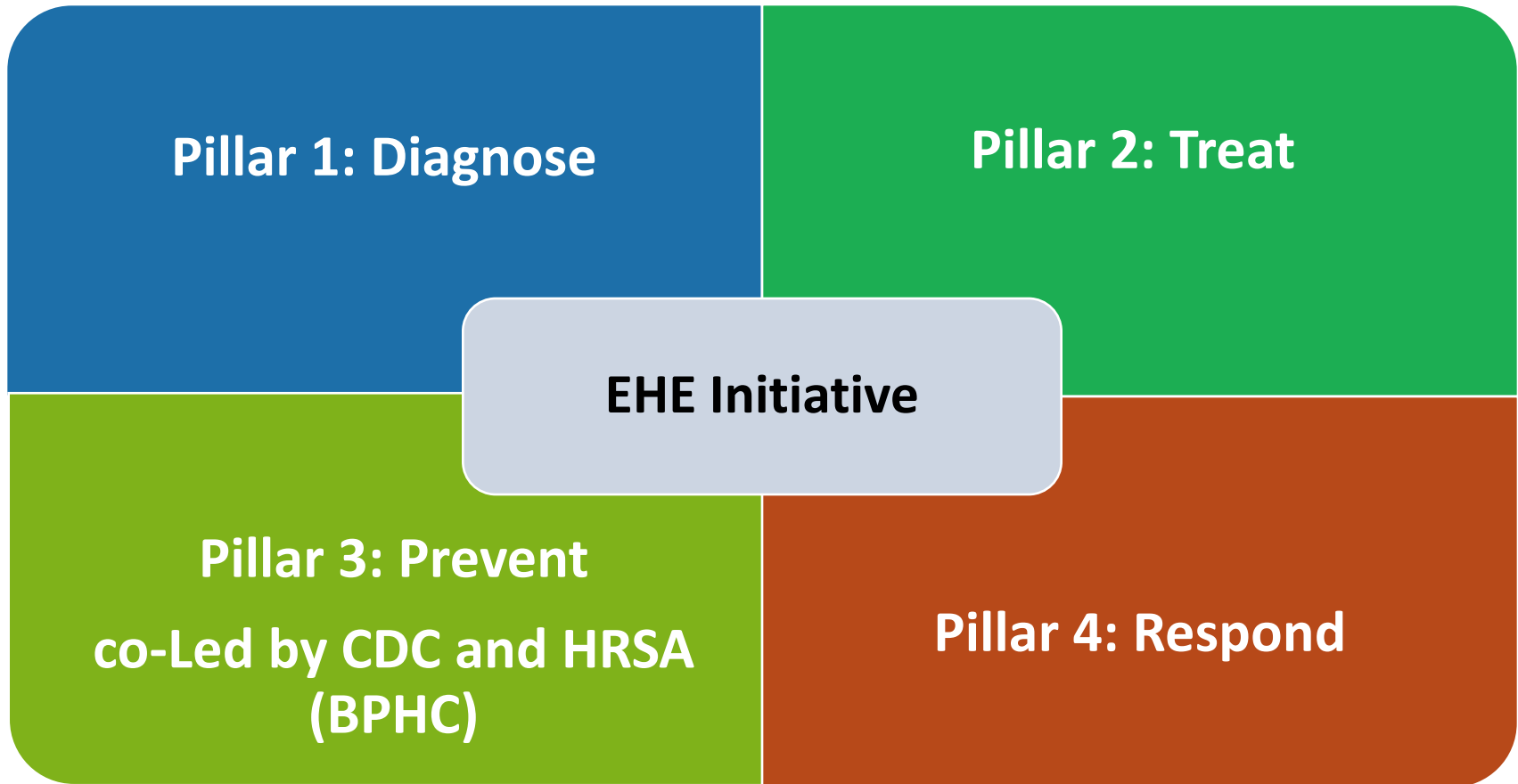
AETC National Coordinating Resource Center

HHS will work with each community to establish local teams on the ground to tailor and implement strategies to:



Diagnose all people with HIV as early as possible.

Treat people with HIV rapidly and effectively to reach sustained viral suppression.



Prevent new HIV transmissions by using proven interventions, including pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) and syringe services programs (SSPs).

Respond quickly to potential HIV outbreaks to get needed prevention and treatment services to people who need them.
